seems to me the boat leaves
about 8 or 9 in the morning
and comes back about 6 in
the evening so it makes
a nice day's trip.

It's only about a 4 hour
drive to Mexico too so we
should be able to make
it down there some day too.

We'd sure love to see
Cathy and Margaret. Chris talks
about them so much.

We went to Pomona Friday
morning and almost bought
out the store with things for
baby and a few clothes for
Chris + Davey. We have everything
we really need now but I would
love to have a bottle sterilizer.
It is so much easier and faster
than boiling them.

Davey is walking now.
Not too good yet but he is
learning fast. Another week
or two and he probably won't
crawl at all. Remember how
hard we tried to make Chris
take just one step alone or

her birthday. I wish you
were going to be here to
make Davey a little cake
like the one you made Chris.
She had so much fun with
that. Will take pictures of
Davey with his cake and
presents and send them to
you. It doesn't hardly seem
possible that he should be
having a birthday so soon.
This year has sure gone fast.

Chris is playing out without
a shirt and I'd better get her
in before she turns too pink.
